- 3.1 **A229 Slip Road Lights** KCC have informed the Council that the lights at the bottom end of the slip road (Columns 6-10) are working. However, they are still having problems with the remaining columns and looking to schedule in further works at these lights. The Clerk is still pursuing this with KCC.
- 3.2 **A229 Accidents** The Committee agreed that the Council should push for a 50mph speed limit that should run the whole length of the A229 from Blue Bell Hill until the 50mph zone as you enter Maidstone. The Clerk has written to the Director of Highways at KCC and has received the following reply: -

"The A229 Bluebell Hill is reviewed on annual basis, but should a serious collision occur a further investigation is undertaken.

This investigation will review the incident to establish cause, which will assist in our crash remedial activities.

Whilst we receive many requests to implement improvements and safety measures on the highway, we prioritise our efforts at location where there is a pattern of incidents where engineering intervention could help to prevent or reduce road crashes.

On review of the historic data there is no pattern which would support a change to the speed limit, and whilst there have been changes to the route the current speed limit remains in accordance with the Department for Transports circular 01/2013 Setting Speed Limits.

At this stage we have no plans to undertake any improvement schemes at this location although we will of course continue to monitor this route."
