

## TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOOTPATH/CYCLE PATH

This path is closed due to a severe landslip and failure of the river retaining wall.

Regrettably we were unable to maintain the barriers at the slip site in a safe condition as some users went to extreme lengths to remove them.

The path will remain closed until it is safe to re-open and the possible timescale is as follows:

- Site investigation and design work (delayed from March by the Covid19 outbreak) started on 8<sup>th</sup> June and may take between 4 and 8 weeks to complete.
- Once a design for the repairs has been completed (we are expecting to have to sheet pile approximately 100m of retaining wall from a barge and then re-construct a large section of the path) consents will be sought from the Environment Agency and for any protected species that may be present. This may take between 2 and 12 weeks.
- Once consents have been granted, we will need to appoint a contractor normal procurement rules would require this to be by competitive tender which could take 6 to 8 weeks unless we can get dispensation to appoint direct without tender.
- Once a contractor is appointed they will have to programme in the work at this stage it is a complete unknown how long this could be.
- The work itself will then need to be undertaken and could possibly take around 12 weeks.
- Funding for the work needs to be secured. A large proportion of the West Kent Public Rights of Way budget has been set aside for this work, and other sources of funding are being looked at but there is a possibility that the work may have to be spread over two financial years.
- There is a very slim chance that the work could be completed by late Autumn but a more realistic estimate would be Spring/Summer 2021.
- When work at the slip site commences and that part of the path can be made secure, we would hope to re-open the cul-de-sacs on both sides but regrettably, if users tried to use it as a through route during the works we would have to reinstate the full closure.
- At present, these timescales are our best guesses and we will update these notices as things become clearer.
